2015 PROXY FORM INSTRUCTIONS

1. Appointment of a proxy

You must write the name of the person you wish to appoint as your proxy in the space provided. Your proxy does not need to be a member of auDA.

If you do not name a proxy, or your named proxy does not attend the meeting, the chairperson of the AGM will be your proxy.

2. Voting

If you wish to direct your proxy how to vote in respect of the proposed resolutions, you must tick the appropriate box. If you do not tick a box, your proxy may vote as he or she thinks fit.

If you are a member of the Supply Class, you may vote for up to two candidates for election as a Supply Class director. If you vote for none by leaving the boxes blank, your proxy may vote as he or she thinks fit. If you vote for only one candidate, your proxy will vote for that candidate but not any other candidate.

If you are a member of the Demand Class, you may vote for up to two candidates for election as a Demand Class director. If you vote for none by leaving the boxes blank, your proxy may vote as he or she thinks fit. If you vote for only one candidate, your proxy will vote for that candidate but not any other candidate.

If you have not named a proxy, or your named proxy does not attend the meeting, the chairperson of the AGM will be your proxy. NB auDA's practice is that the chairperson does not cast votes for which he is the proxy unless the member directs the vote – ie. if no box is ticked, then no vote is cast.

3. Signing the form

You must sign the form in the space provided by using your hand signature as follows:

- Individual: where the membership is in the name of an individual, that individual must sign.
- Company: where the membership is in the name of a company, the company's nominee as listed on the auDA members register must sign.
- Power of Attorney: to sign under a Power of Attorney you must have already lodged this document with auDA, or please attach a certified copy to this form when you return it.
